Attendance

We know that there might be lots of valid reasons for your child being away from school. The Government classes good attendance as being 96% and above. If your child's attendance falls below 90%, they are classed as being persistently absent. Children arriving more than 5 minutes after their allocated start time are classed as late. They will need to be signed in at the main school office by a parent, carer or adult and a reason for their lateness given.

Missing school will make your child fall behind in lessons and will impact on their academic progress and achievement. Being late can also have an impact on your child's attendance figures.

If we have concerns about your child's attendance, we will notify you of this, continue to monitor their attendance and work with you to help improve this.
